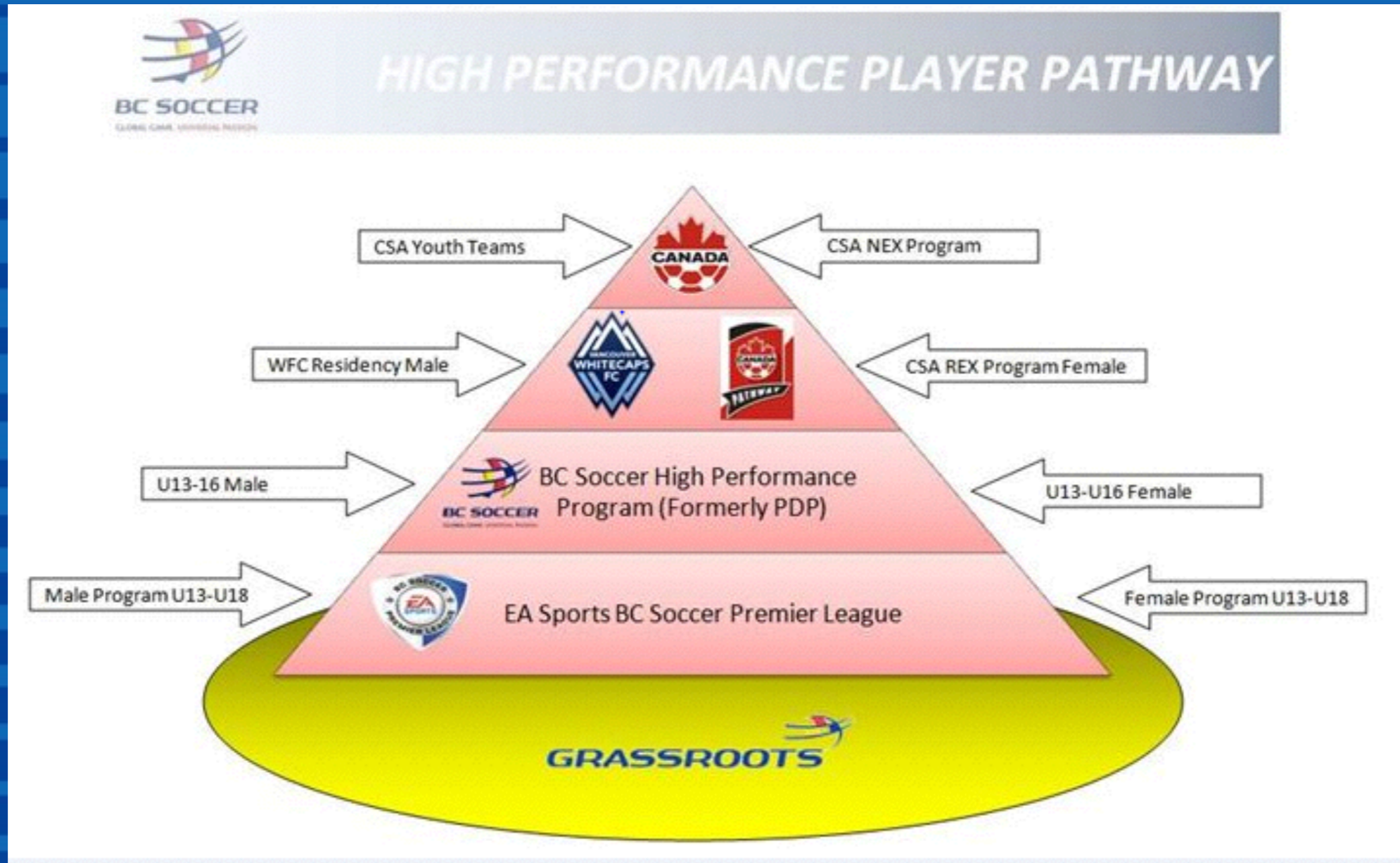

BCSPL Evaluation Process

1. Coastal BCSPL Coach Appointment in October
2. Player Recommendations from partner clubs (age group Head Coach, Head of Player Development and Technical Director)
3. Coastal BCSPL Coach attendance at club games and training
4. Coastal BCSPL Coach invites players to separate training and games
5. Coastal BCSPL Open Evaluations- Mid January
6. Team Selected End January/Beginning February

Metro Evaluation Process

1. DCS Metro Coach Appointment in October
2. Player recommendations from partner clubs (Age group Head Coach, Head of Player Development, Technical Director)
3. DCS Metro Coach works with BCSPL coach on evaluation process
4. DCS Metro Coach attends club games and training sessions
5. DCS Metro Coach attends Coastal BCSPL Open Evaluations
6. DCS Open Evaluations- within 2 weeks prior to Spring Break
7. Team Selected within a week of the final evaluation

Division 1-2 Evaluation Process

1. SDU Division 1-2 Coach Appointment in February.
2. SDU Coach review players with Age Group Head Coach, Head of Player Development and Technical Director.
3. Evaluation based on development throughout the season.
